

TITLE 15.

MOTOR VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC

CHAPTER 15-500. STOPS REQUIRED

15-501. Cutting Through Corners.

(1) No driver of a motor vehicle shall drive through any private property, such as an oil station or lot, or similar area whether vacant or not, with the intent to avoid obedience to any traffic regulation set forth in this chapter.

(2) No driver of a motor vehicle shall drive through any private driveway, lot or similar area, or any business establishment including but not limited to a retail store, drive-in market, drive-in food business or any other kind of business establishment where trade is maintained or carried on, for the purpose and with the intent of harassing and annoying the owner thereof or his patrons.

(3) Driving by any person of a motor vehicle contrary to the provisions of this section shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section.

15-502. Stop When Traffic Obstructed. No driver shall enter an intersection or a marked crosswalk unless there is sufficient space on the other side of the intersection or crosswalk to accommodate the vehicle he is operating without obstructing the passage of other vehicles or pedestrians, notwithstanding any traffic control signal indication to proceed.

15-503. Use of Engine Brakes Restricted. The use of a dynamic braking device (commonly referred to as Jake brakes, engine brakes, or compression brake, used primarily on trucks for the conversion of the engine from an internal combustion engine to an air compressor for the purpose of braking without the use of wheel brakes) is unlawful by any person operating any motor vehicle so equipped, for the purpose of slowing or stopping said vehicle, except for the aversion of imminent danger, within the City limits of Tremonton City.
