## Utility Bills

**Water:** Base Rate \$18.90 + Water Use Rate

Tier 1 – 0 – 10,000 gallons per month, \$1.50 per 1,000 gallons

Tier 2 – 10,001 – 40,000 gallons per month, \$1.75 per 1,000 gallons

Tier 3 – 40,001 – 70,000 gallons per month, \$2.50 per 1,000 gallons

Tier 4 – 70,001 – 100,000 gallons per month, \$3.00 per 1,000 gallons

Tier 5 – 100,001 – 130,000 gallons per month, \$3.50 per 1,000 gallons

Tier 6 – Above 130,001 gallons per month, \$4.00 per 1,000 gallons

**Storm Drain:** \$4.00 per month

**Sewer Collection:** \$5.50 per month

**Waste Water Treatment:** \$28.30 per month. Businesses are charged for sewer based on the amount of water used. The charge is \$1.15 per 1,000 gallons.

**Garbage:** \$15.53 per month. If you need a second can, the charge is an additional \$15.53 per month plus a one-time non-refundable deposit of \$150.00. Call 435-257-9500 to request a second can.

**Garbage Pick Up:** North side of Main Street pick up every Friday, south side of Main Street pick up every Monday. Have it out early or the night before.

**Recycling Can:** \$18.90 per month. A new can is \$50.00. Pick up is every other week. Recyclable Material includes: Paper, Newspaper, Magazine, Plastic, Cardboard, Aluminum and Tin cans.

**Deposit:** If you are renting, a \$100 deposit is required to obtain service. The deposit is held until you move out, at which time it would then be applied to your final bill. Any resulting credit will be refunded.

-Bills are sent out by the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month and are due by the last day of the month. If payment is not received by the last day, then a \$15.00 late fee is added.

-The minimum bill is \$72.23 per month plus usage. If you have a recycling can, your bill will be \$91.13 per month plus usage. You can drop payments off at the drive up drop box in the parking lot, the box by the front door, U.S. Mail, in person, or online at [www.tremontocity.gov](http://www.tremontocity.gov)

-Arrangements for payment on delinquent utility charges made prior to the issuance of water shut-off notices shall include provisions wherein no one shall have a remaining total balance due which is greater than an amount equal to the basic charges for one and one-half month's utility service (currently \$108.35).

-Water off day is generally scheduled for the last Wednesday of the month. If water service is discontinued, the service fee is \$35 to reconnect service. After-hour service fee is \$75. If water has been turned off for non-payment, the city must be contacted to turn the water back on. If a resident turns their water back on, they must pay a \$100 illegal turn on fee.

### **My Water Advisor**

Tremonton City is installing new meters that have the capability of allowing customers to view water usage daily. Customers can track their water usage, which will help with water conservation.

### **Tremonton-Garland City Police Department**

The Police Department provides 24-hour services within Tremonton City, 365 days per year. The department works cohesively with all surrounding law enforcement agencies and partners with the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) task force and the Box Elder County Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team. The Tremonton Police Department has developed into one of the most progressive and professional small agencies in the State of Utah, known for its reputation for pride and excellence. The department utilizes technology, training, community policing, and evidence-based strategies to combat crime. In recent years, Tremonton has seen a decrease in most major crime categories, including narcotics, burglary, theft, and sex crimes.

Please be aware that there is no parking on any public street during December, January, and February from 12:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. to allow for snow removal. Property owners must keep sidewalks and fire hydrants clear of snow. Additionally, no parking is allowed on any public street when snow removal is either in progress or imminent. Violators will be cited. See Ordinance 15-213 at [tremontonciv.gov](http://tremontonciv.gov) for more information.

### **Animal Control/Nuisances**

**Animals:** Check zoning restrictions before moving domestic animals into the City.

**Dogs:** Each household is limited to a maximum of two dogs over six months old. Each of which must have a current rabies vaccination and a valid Tremonton dog license. An exception to the two-dog limit is by requesting a kennel license from the Tremonton Planning Commission. A kennel license is only allowed in certain zones in the City. New residents have 30 days in which to license a dog. Licenses for a spayed/neutered dog are \$10 and \$30 if the dog is not spayed/neutered (proof of spay/neuter must be provided). Dog licenses must be renewed each year before the end of March. A \$15 late fee is added to the cost of a dog license after 30 days in the case of a new move in, and after March 31 for all previously licensed dogs. Dogs may not run loose (leash law) nor disturb the neighborhood with prolonged or excessive barking.

**Nuisances:** Tremonton City requires that any and all real property be kept free of any definable definition of a nuisance. (Please see Tremonton Ordinance 10-331 Definition of Nuisance) Failure to do so could result in possible fines, and or potential court appearance.

### **Court**

Tremonton City Justice Court is located in the City Building at 102 S Tremont St. The Court Office is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Court is held Mondays from 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. and an all-day session held one Monday per month. ### **Public Works Department**

The Public Works Complex is located at 300 East 1200 South. Yard clippings, which are used for compost, can be disposed of seasonally at the Green Waste facility located at 8700 W 6800 N Tremonton, UT. Compost is available, for \$7.50 per scoop. You must pay for the compost at the City Office and take the receipt to the plant and they will load it for you. They load Monday & Tuesday 9:00 A.M.-12:00 P.M. and Wednesday, Thursday & Friday 1:00 P.M. -4:00 P.M.

**Sewers:** Fats, oils, and grease aren't just bad for your arteries and your waistline, they are bad for sewers too. Sewer overflows and backups can cause health hazards, damage home interiors, and threaten the environment. An increasingly common cause of overflow is sewer pipes blocked by grease. Most of us know grease is a byproduct of cooking. Grease is found in such things as: *meat fats, lard, cooking oil, shortening, butter, margarine, food scraps, baking goods, sauces, and dairy products.* Grease is washed in the plumbing system, usually through the kitchen sink. Grease sticks to the insides of sewer pipes, both on your property and in the streets. Over time, the grease can build up and block the entire pipe. *Never pour grease down sink drains, in garbage disposals, or in toilets. Scrape grease and food scraps into a can or the trash for disposal.*

**Water Conservation:** Even the smallest drip from a worn washer can waste 50 or more gallons of water a day. Larger leaks can waste hundreds of gallons.

- ▶ Use your automatic dishwasher and washing machine only for full loads
- ▶ If you wash dishes by hand, don't leave the water running for rinsing
- ▶ Keep a bottle of drinking water in the refrigerator. This ends the wasteful practice of running tap water to cool it before drinking.
- ▶ Plant drought-resistant trees and plants
- ▶ Put a layer of mulch around trees and plants
- ▶ Use a broom to clean driveways, sidewalks, and steps. Using a hose to push around leaves and dirt can waste hundreds of gallons
- ▶ Water your lawn only when needed and during the cool parts of the day
- ▶ Check for leaks in pipes, hoses, faucets, and couplings

**Lawn watering:** Turf studies have shown that most lawns only need to be watered every 3 - 4 days to stay healthy and green. Watering every day creates shallow roots. Watering infrequently develops deep roots and healthier turf. Grass roots grow deeper into the soil and become stronger with less watering. If grass does not spring back after being stepped on it is time to water. Water only when needed.

### **Fire Department and Ambulance**

The Fire Station is located at 95 South 100 West. Tremonton Volunteer Fire Department was organized in the fall of 1937. Today the department consists of full and part-time members, most of which are certified Emergency Medical Technicians and certified Firefighters. The Fire Department operates the communities' ambulance service with four Advanced Life Support ambulances. Tremonton Fire Department is an ISO class 4 Department. The Fire Department continues to maintain the latest equipment and training available. It is a community-oriented Fire Department providing fire safety, first aid instruction, CPR, and CERT (Citizens Emergency Response Training) to the community. For non-emergency calls to the Fire Station the number is 435-257-9520. For EMERGENCIES CALL 911.

### **Food Pantry**

The Tremonton Food Pantry provides food and other household items to those in need. The Food Pantry is located at 180 South Tremont Street and is open on Mondays and Tuesdays from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Donations of food or money are always accepted.

### **Parks & Recreation**

Tremonton Recreation offers a variety of competitive sporting programs at a recreational level. All programs are available for both Tremonton residents and residents of neighboring communities for no additional fee. Recreation programs are available for all ages with a variety of activities. ### **Building Permits & Inspections**

Tremonton City contracts our inspector through CityInspect. If you have any questions or need to schedule an inspection, please contact Tyler Seaman at 801-564-0897. ### **Library**

The Tremonton Library is located at 210 North Tremont Street. Open Monday through Friday from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm and Saturdays from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm. Computers are available for internet use. ### **Senior Center**

The Bear River Valley Senior Center is a great place to exercise the body, expand the mind and feed your belly, all while making new friends and strengthening relationships. We offer many opportunities to all those who are 60 years and older. Please stop in and let us introduce ourselves to you. We will give you a newsletter and a tour of our facility. We are located at 510 W 1000 N. Our service hours are 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. Monday – Friday. We are closed on Holidays. We serve lunch at noon and would love to have you join us. Please RSVP at 435-257-9455 or 435-230-1353. We can't wait to meet you.

**Available activities for Senior Citizens include:** Foot clinic, blood pressure testing, health fairs, quilting five days a week, pool tables, and exercise classes. They also have computers available for use.

### **Business Licenses**

Tremonton City Ordinance states that anyone engaging in business within the incorporated City limits must first obtain a business license. There are very few exceptions, and they include: a home occupation grossing less than \$600 per year; home instruction of the arts; religious, charitable, and other non-profit organizations which are tax exempt under the laws of the United States or the State of Utah; and State licensed contractors who have proof that they have a valid business license from the City in which their business is located. All business licenses expire on December 31 of each year. It is the responsibility of the business owner to renew the license annually and notify the City of any changes, additions, and deletions that may occur. Failure to renew a license by February 28 may result in a penalty. Business licenses may be applied for at the city office. All home occupations must be licensed and must obtain a Conditional Use Permit before applying for a business license. Applications for the Conditional Use Permit are obtained from the City Treasurer/Receptionist.

### **Riverview Cemetery**

The Riverview Cemetery is located at approximately 175 East 1200 South in Tremonton. The earliest known burials occurred in 1907. Among the notable burials are those of the Borgstrom brothers: Clyde, LeRoy, Rolon, and Rulon, who were all killed during World War II between March and August of 1944. There is a bulletin board at the cemetery with names of those buried in the cemetery. For information on the cemetery, to purchase burial plots, or to arrange a burial, contact the City Recorder.

## **Econo Waste Guidelines for Proper Automated Container Use:**

Please be aware that route pickup times are subject to change **WITHOUT** notice. You will have an established pickup day, but not a set pickup time each week. As such, containers **MUST** be placed curbside the night before your pick-up day. If you forget to place it out the night before and you are missed as a result, we cannot come back; you will have to wait until your next pick up day.

- Please place your container in the proper place; the ideal location is to the left or right of your driveway, and as close to the road as possible. If there is no curb on your street, the container must be within 2 feet of the asphalt. The container should be on reasonably level ground so it won't tip over. Be sure the handle of the container faces towards your house.
- Containers must be placed at least 4-6 feet away from other containers or objects (i.e. mailboxes, light posts, basketball hoops, fences, etc.)
- Please do not block containers with vehicles. It is best to place containers **at least 20 feet away** from any vehicle.
- Containers **SHOULD NOT** be overloaded. If the lid on your container is open more than 2 inches, it is considered to be overloaded. Containers that are overloaded may not dump correctly and may spill trash. If this is the case, the driver will not be required to empty it. Spills caused by overloaded containers are the resident's responsibility to clean up. Please cut up long items into short pieces so they fit properly in the can. Cut up empty boxes or crush them flat. If you occasionally have more items that will fit into your container, ask a neighbor if they have extra room and will let you put your extra in their container. If you need another container, please contact your City's Public Work Dept. for options.
- Containers may be used for regular household garbage and for yard & garden clippings that have been cut to fit properly into the container. Please put garbage into bags and tie them closed so they do not spill. This will allow the container to be emptied better and will keep the container cleaner.
- Please **DO NOT** place any of the following items into your container:
  - NO** Dangerous or hazardous materials
  - NO** Medical waste or needles
  - NO** Hot ashes, fireworks, or any other flammable items
  - NO** Rocks, dirt, bricks, concrete, or any similar items
  - NO** Construction debris (i.e. carpet, sheetrock, tile)
  - NO** Dead animals
  - NO** Propane tanks, batteries, tires, tanks or barrels of any kind
  - NO** Furniture and/or large appliances

**We strive to provide the best service possible. Our drivers will use their best discretion and may not service a container if there are any violations of these guidelines. Thank you for helping us to keep your neighborhood safe and clean!**
